Message from our Locum Minister

Hello again

Time for another magazine article.

So, I sit down to write on a beautiful sunny day. At this point the weather has been gorgeous for a few weeks now. But of course, I can't predict what it will be like by the time you read this, but I hope it is still good as by then, I will be on holiday.

Over the last few weeks my Sunday theme has been parables, so sticking to that idea I am I thinking that the weather is a kind of parable for life.

Our Scottish weather is so unpredictable but that is so like life. We don't know what tomorrow will be like. Just like the weather

it might be great, or it might be rotten, it might be like a beautiful calm sunny day when everything goes well, not a care in the world. Or it might be like a raging thunderstorm, extremely unpleasant even scary.

But the good news about both the weather and life is that God is in control. He is with us on a sunny afternoon at the beach or in a raging thunderstorm, He is with us when life is good, and we are happy, and he is with us when things go wrong, when we are suffering.

So, as we move towards winter and the weather gets more unpleasant let's just keep one thing always in mind that God is with us.

I will just end by sharing my favourite psalm with you.

Psalm 121:1 I lift up my eyes to the hills-- where does my help come from? ² My help comes from the LORD, the Maker of heaven and earth. ³ He will not let your foot slip-- he who watches over you will not slumber; ⁴ indeed, he who watches over Israel will neither slumber nor sleep. ⁵ The LORD watches over you-- the LORD is your shade at your right hand; ⁶ the sun will not harm you by day, nor the moon by night. ⁷ The LORD will keep you from all harm-- he will watch over your life; ⁸ the LORD will watch over your coming and going both now and forevermore.

SPC – 2025 AND BEYOND AN UPDATE

A small, dedicated band has been engaged over the summer months to take forward some of the ideas that were announced in an earlier Prospect.

A brief summary of progress is offered thus.

- A special commemorative Church Service has been planned, (See separate entry from Alastair Sim, Session Clerk).
- A Director of a leading Glasgow construction company, and a former 190th BB member, is carrying out an overview of the development plans we suggested for premises and grounds. He will advise on feasibility, planning permissions and projected costs. This information will be presented to Trustees for decisions on next steps.
- With a view to increasing income from hall lets, premises are being listed on a free website "Hallshire" to attract additional users.
- Installation of a stained-glass window is being considered. Cost will be around £5,000.
 Assuming approval from Trustees, a Go Fund Me page will be launched on Facebook to cover costs.
- A list of Anniversary Events is being finalised for 2025/2026, commencing in September.
 Discussions are ongoing with various performing arts groups to augment a number of SPC
 activities, with the aim of attracting large numbers of people to our church. We anticipate
 costs can be offset by income generated and by grant funding.
- Some novel methods are being considered to increase regular funding for the Church. Proposals will be presented to Trustees in the Autumn.

As plans develop, the onus on the present committee of five people will greatly expand. They will need help from additional volunteers. If you or someone you know would be willing to help, please contact Alastair asap.
