In conclusion, I wish you and yours happiness, health and wellbeing during our Autumn season.



SPC - 2025 AND BEYOND

AN UPDATE

In the September edition of Prospect, a list of planned activities was outlined. The first activity, our 125th Anniversary Church Service was held on the 21st of September. A most enjoyable event and an opportunity to meet old and new friends.

Second activity referred to work being carried out to determine the feasibility of proposed developments to premises and grounds. The SPC -2025 AND BEYOND committee feel this is necessary to update church facilities, make premises more attractive and maximise utilisation.

There is a UK wide acceptance of a staged approach to development laid down in the Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA) Plan of Work. An early stage is a Feasibility Study, which is carried out by qualified persons and establishes the practicalities, implications, costs, local impact and potential benefits.

David Thorn, Director of Morris Spottiswood and a colleague have visited and are in the process of compiling a proposal and a quotation for a Feasibility Study. It is estimated this will cost around £2.5K and if approved by Trustees will be completed by the turn of the year. Assuming approval by Trustees the next Stage will be fundraising, mainly via grant funding applications to the Church of Scotland and other funding agencies.

This will be a protracted activity and will require progress through RIBA stages, probably extending to at least two years before work can be completed.

Another activity being considered is Fundraising, via increased hall lets and increased giving from members and non-members.

Church Premises have been listed on HALLSHIRE, a free internet site which is regularly accessed by community groups wishing to hire space. A "Friends of SPC" scheme aimed at non-members in our growing community who might have an attachment to the CoS and who might wish to make a regular contribution to their local Church is also being assessed.

The greatly expanded population of Stepps has prompted SPC-AND BEYOND committee members to consider how best our Church, its services and facilities can be publicised to the community. Social Media posting is generally accepted as the most effective means. In this regard we need help. Can anyone offer advice on the best way to post weekly updates on Church activities to members and non-members. Should it be via What's App, Twitter, Instagram or any other method?
