SPC 2025 – AND BEYOND

PROGRESS REPORT

PREMISES/GROUNDS DEVELOPMENT

Strategy –

To update premises and create additional space for let and income generation.

A quote for £2,475 was approved by Trustees to engage McLennan Architects (part of Morris Spottiswood Construction Group) to produce a Feasibility Plan, a necessary stage in the Royal Institute of British Architects Plan for Growth, which is the nationally accepted methodology before funding applications and possibly construction.

OUTREACH

Strategy-

To improve communication and engagement within the population of Stepps, which has grown dramatically to a “small town” classification of 7,000 in recent years, to encourage a faith-based community spirit.

An initiative to create a *Welcome to Stepps* booklet containing a “people’s history” of Stepps was launched in October via PROSPECT. Young and old have been asked to contribute first or second-hand accounts of local facts and anecdotes that could prove interesting to new residents. A price for production of an A5 is being sought prior to approaching funders for grant aid. The estimated cost is £1,750 for 1,000 copies, funded by grant aid.

A plan to create an on-line link to residents who are non-members will be launched early January. The plan is for members to liaise with neighbours, friends etc who may be interested in being kept up to date with SPC activities via social media.

A review of existing community activities will be carried out to identify gaps in service provision the Church could address via courses and programmes supported by grant aid.

HALL LETS

Strategy-

To continue with our successful halls utilisation and increase footfall and income.

Church premises have been listed on Hallshire, a free online listing of premises available for hire.

Premises utilisation figures are being calculated to identify possible income targets.

FUNDRAISING

Strategy-

To establish additional and sustainable income streams.

A “Friends of SPC” funding appeal to non-members who may wish to support our activities, and a Stewardship Campaign will be considered by Trustees at their next meeting.
