#### Pastoral Letter Deacon Claire Herbert



Autumn is almost upon us. The keen gardeners will note the leaves beginning to turn and the floral displays die back.

Some of you will be looking forward to the crisp leaves through which to trudge and the frosted glitter upon the fences.

After a summer which began with elections, then Euro's and Olympics, we have been reminded of the diversity of cultures and the gifts of different nations. There is a competitive urge.

But we see on our news screens that across the world and even here in the UK there is conflict and division. Making life feel intense.

I have been reading a book by Ruth Rice called "Slow Down, Show Up and Pray" which was published in 2021. In it Ruth writes "this is a call to do less, to simplicity, to stillness, to a way of being, not

to a flurry of doing." (p9)

After a summer of rest our program of clubs and activities resumes and as we do so I wonder if we might not rush to "a flurry of doing" but rather approach this new season with an atmosphere of simply "being" with one another.

As we look to the next step towards our proposed linkage with our friends at Garthamlock and Ruchazie church we are planning more opportunities to 'be with' one another. I would encourage you to make every effort to strengthen established ties or to begin 'being' together and forming new friendships as we move towards the conclusion of the formal process and look to the future together.

The next planned step is to put before the congregation the 'basis of linkage document' and hold a formal vote on the matter. There are no postal or proxy votes and only those listed on the congregational role can vote on the appointed date. This will be set by the presbytery and notice will be given in church on 2 Sundays prior to the vote. If you would like to check if you are on the congregational roll please speak to Lorraine, session clerk or myself.

As the chill returns to the evening air, let us take this chance to draw closer to one another in friendship and companionship, as a sign of our communion with Christ who came to invite us to His table.

On 1st September we are holding communion, this is the Lords table and all are welcome to celebrate with us and to offer fellowship to one another and to those soon to be newly ordained. Come and simply 'be'.

#### News of the Linkage with Garthamlock, Craigend and Ruchazie.

We are working diligently towards the service of linkage and below is the:

#### **Proposed Timeline for Linkage**

Congregational Vote – Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> October Approval by National Committee – October meeting Approval by Presbytery – Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> November Service of Linkage – Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> November

**Please Note:** On the day of the vote, only those present will be allowed to vote – there are no postal votes or proxy votes. Each person's name will be checked off the roll before a voting paper is issued. To check your name is on the roll please speak to your elder or to Lorraine, Session Clerk.

Once the linkage is complete the two congregations will share a minister and work more closely on mission activities across the parish while retaining their individual congregational status. The most noticeable change will be to the worship times, this is to allow for the minister of the linked charge to take both services and will come into effect on the date the two congregations are formally linked – which will be in advance of any vacancy process.

Sunday club and Bible class has started again. All children aged 3 to Primary 6 are invited to come and join us on a Sunday morning for stories, games and crafts.



### Free digital support helpline provided by People Know How

Our Digital support helpline provides digital support to anyone in Scotland. It is free to call and is open from Monday to Friday, 10am to 4pm.

- Anyone can call this freephone number and receive support and advice on topics including:
- Using devices like smartphones, tablets, laptops or desktop computers
- Connecting to the internet
- Navigating the web and social media
- Completing everyday tasks online
- Connecting with the community, family and friends
- Managing finances, paying bills and saving money online
- Reducing costs (energy, data plans, shopping, etc.)
- Finding opportunities for education and employment
- Feeling less isolated and having someone to talk to

The helpline is run by charity <u>People Know How</u>, in partnership with the Scottish Government and the Scottish Council for Voluntary Organisations (SCVO). It forms part of the charity's <u>Reconnect</u> service, which aims to improve digital inclusion across Scotland.

Part of the wider Connecting Scotland scheme set up during the pandemic, the helpline was set up to support those who received devices as part of that programme. It has since been expanded to help anyone in Scotland who needs digital support, regardless of whether they interacted with the original scheme.

The charity has supported thousands of people through the helpline.

Sisters <u>Greta and Heidi</u> received iPads that made their life in a rural part of Scotland much easier, with continual support from the helpline that allowed them do things like order food and essentials to their home instead of making the 60-mile round trip to the nearest shop.

<u>David</u> was able to solve connectivity issues after recently moving to Scotland, allowing him to apply for local college courses and build his skills as he supports his family.

<u>Mary</u> still calls in regularly for advice after the team supported her to regain access to her iPad, which is vital in her life to access medicine and food and to communicate with friends and family.

<u>Rachel</u> eased her worries online and improved her knowledge of online safety, learning about spotting spam emails and identifying trustworthy websites.



#### Congregational Vote Sunday 6th October

A congregational vote is to be held on Sunday the 6<sup>th</sup> of October on our proposed linkage with Garthamlock, Ruchazie & Craigend Parish Church of Scotland.

## New Alarm at the Extension of the Administrative Detention of Layan Nasir, a 23-year-old Palestinian Anglican woman held without charge since 6 April 2024

**Layan Nasir** 

'I have just had bad news that Layan's detention has been extended for a further four months. Very upsetting.' So, reports Richard Sewell this morning, Dean of St George's College in East Jerusalem, replying to our request today for an update on Layan Nasir.

Three weeks ago, we learned that an Israeli Military judge had denied an appeal for her release. An Action Alert issued by the US Episcopal Church's Office of Government Relations on 11 July voiced deep concern in about the manner in which Layan was taken, her ongoing detention, and the broader system of administrative detention that means many thousands of Palestinians are kept in custody for months, their families barred from visiting. You will wish to know more.

Writing on 12 July, the Rev Dr Don Binder, Chaplain to Hosam Naoum, Archbishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem and Primate of the Anglican Communion in the Middle East, provided background to Layan's story. 'Back in April, Nasir's mother, Lulu Nasir, told Sky News that soldiers arrived at the family's home at 4am on April 6 and threatened them with guns as they searched the house before taking her daughter into custody. Israel hasn't given any reason for Nasir's detention. She is being held at Damon Prison near Haifa.'

Layan is a member of St Peter's Anglican Church in the Occupied West Bank city of Birzeit. No timeline for charges, trial or release has been set in her case. Nasir's priest, the Rev Fadi Diab, and her family have been barred from visiting her.

Israel has arrested more than 9,700 Palestinians from the West Bank since the Israel-Hamas war started in October 2023, according to Addameer, a Palestinian prisoner support and human rights NGO based in Ramallah in the West Bank.

Call for prayer and advocacy:

We join with Layan's family (mother Lulu, father Sami, twin brother Basil), her Church (the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem, our partner), and fellow students at Birzeit University on the West Bank, in requesting that you remember Layan and her fellow detainees in prayer.

We appeal to you to write letters to your MSPs and MPs to advocate for her release and, while her detention continues, for her family and Rev Diab to be allowed to visit her.

A conversation in June with Archbishop Hosam saw him emphasise the point that Layan is being held in administrative detention, urging that we call for an end to detention without charge.

Can we remember Layan and her fellow detainees as though we were in Damon prison with them? Let us be bold to take up this call, remembering with humility that we rest in the power of the Holy Spirit, as we search for the words to say. Thank-you.


