

For those of us who are worship leaders it also marks the beginning of a new year of the Lectionary, the scheme of readings that we turn to for the preaching God's Word. This year I along with Sunday Club and Bible Classes will also seek the help of "Spill the Beans". This guide through the lectionary is written by a group go Scots based worship leaders. we will begin with our journey through Advent and the writers suggest we focus on the theme of:-

#### Holding On

Please hold the line. your call is important to us.... please hold we, will answer as soon as possible... you are now 33rd in line, please hold a little while longer" Holding on the phone, while listening to some strange section of music can be so frustrating. For many centuries the Hebrew peoples had been holding on. #### **Local Church Review**

At Stepps, we have now completed our local church review and a report will be submitted to Glasgow Presbytery. Our report was largely based on the discussions we had as a congregation in May. From that and our meeting with our reviewer, Rev Mark Malcolm, an action plan for the next 5 years at Stepps Parish Church has been developed, which will be presented to Glasgow Presbytery. This is to continue on from our 5 year 'Take Stepps' mission plan since we will undertake our final review of 'Take Stepps' in Spring 2020.

The key areas included in the action plan are:

# Church community: Engaging with each other (Discipleship/ Stewardship)

Participate in the Narrative of Generosity stewardship programme with the aim of better participation of congregation in undertaking roles and tasks around the church and retaining financial stability.

# Worship: Engaging with God

Identify courses & programmes that are being run to equip lay person to participate more fully in worship and following from stewardship programme identify people within the congregation willing to participate more fully in leading worship. The aim is to have members of the congregation who are confident to lead part or all of worship service. We should remember that Rev MacRae will be retiring in 3 years time.


### Mission: Engaging with the world

- 1. Raise profile of Stepps Parish Church as an integral part of community life and promote the building of community by
- a. Continuing to host 2 community festivals each year.
- b. Supporting and further develop Chestnut café as a social contact point in the community
- c. Ensuring church buildings are accessible for wider community use
- d. Ensure use of social media and digital platforms is maximised to engage with local community
- 2. Identify a time and place to offer a first step in a faith journey to those without church ties and establish a connect point through
- a. Reflect on impact of Breathing Space.
- b. Explore mindfulness/ mediation session
- c. Integrate church youth organisations with wider church events

- d. Explore how to support a deepening of faith through Messy Church
- e. Offer discussion group/ discipleship course on exploring faith
